The purpose of the interview is to assess the applicant's level of motivation, communication skills, and overall understanding of the chosen educational program.

1 General Provisions

1.1. The Program on the rules for conducting interviews at the NJSC "Aktobe Regional University named after K. Zhubanov" (hereinafter referred to as the University) regulates the procedure for conducting interviews during the admission of the following categories of applicants: foreign citizens, as well as conscripted soldiers enrolling for the full duration of the bachelor's degree program on a paid basis.

1.2 This Program is developed based on:

- Standard rules for admission to study in educational organizations implementing educational programs of higher and postgraduate education, approved by order of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated October 31, 2018 No. 600;
- Methodological recommendations for the compliance of related groups of educational programs of higher education and specialties of technical and vocational, post-secondary education approved by the Order of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated August 2, 2024 No. 387;

- Rules for admission to study at the University;

- Rules for the recognition of educational documents, approved by order of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated July 12, 2023 No. 268;
- Other legislative and regulatory acts and instructional letters on issues of admission to higher educational institutions.
- 1.3 The result of the interview is assessed as "recommended" / "not recommended."
- 1.4 The interview is conducted either online or offline, based on the preference of international applicants and applicants who have completed military service.
- 1.5 The interview is conducted individually with each candidate by the admissions committee.
- 1.6 The composition of the examination committees is formed from among the University faculty members who have a doctoral or candidate of science degree, or a doctor of philosophy (PhD) degree, master's degree in the relevant field. Members of the examination committees are not allowed to be members of the appeal committee.
- 1.7 The interview is conducted in Kazakh and Russian. The EP "Foreign Philology", the EP of the Heriot-Watt campus "6B07108 Electrical Power Engineering", "6B07209 Petroleum Engineering and Energy Management", "6B06107 Computer Engineering" are conducted only in English.
- 1.8 Based on the results of the interview conducted by the University's Admissions Committee, enrollment is carried out in accordance with the academic calendar no later than 5 (five) calendar days before the start of the academic period.
- 1.9 The interview procedure is formalized by an interview protocol and an interview report in the form according to Appendix 1, 2, in which questions to the applicant are recorded.

1.10 Upon enrollment, applicants are given extracts from the register and kept in their personal files. Those not enrolled are destroyed one year after the end of the entrance examinations.

- 1.11 The interview schedule is determined by the dean of each faculty and approved by the chairman of the admissions committee. The interview schedule is posted on the official website of the University and is communicated to applicants by technical secretaries.
- 1.12 The interview protocol is submitted to the secretary of the examination committee by the responsible secretary of the admissions committee on the day of the interview.
- 1.13 Admission of applicants to the auditorium is carried out upon presentation of a passport or identity card, as well as on the basis of a receipt for the acceptance of documents.

2 MAIN REQUIREMENTS

The main requirements for international candidates and citizens who have completed military service during the interview are:

- 1. Ability to clearly explain the reason for choosing the university;
- 2. Demonstrated interest in the chosen field of study;
- 3. Ability to give accurate answers to interview questions.

- Communication: Ability to clearly and logically articulate thoughts orally, proficiency in Kazakh, Russian, or English at an academic level for communication.
