Report	The object of the study is the Ural-Emba interfluve in the 18th-
	19th centuries, when this territory was "mobile" at the beginning
	of the 18th century – as a result of military clashes, it became a
	nomadic territory of the Kalmyks and Bashkirs for a short time
	and retained the corresponding toponyms and hydronyms here
	until the 19th century. Based on the theory of "Nomadic mental
	map of space", it will be proven that this territory was a nomadic
	camp of the Kazakhs of the Junior Horde.
	Based on various types of sources, including maps depicting
	Kazakh ancestral cemeteries and indicating toponyms, reports of archaeological and ethnographic expeditions, the ethnoterritorial
	settlement of the Kazakhs of the Junior Horde in the 18th–19th
	centuries will be studied and reproduced on thematic maps.
	Particular attention will be paid to the definition and perception
	of the concept of "border" by the Kazakhs in the 18th–19th
	centuries and the policy of the Russian Empire to consolidate its
	power in the Steppe. A study of the maps and routes of Russian
